

First German community wind farm, late 1980s








- local cooperative bank provided loan needed in Lübke Koog;
- locals came up with 2.3 million in equity, roughly 70,000 per person;
- farmers owned property that could be mortgaged;
- "We didn't know what to wear when you sign a 16 million deutsche mark contract."




Renewables ownership 2010




93 percent of Germans support further growth of renewables



Expert reasons for energy transition:


- 1) Climate change
