Con el Lema "Las familias felices construyen mejores individuos, sociedades y economías", El VII Congreso Mundial de Familias (WCF, por sus siglas en inglés) se llevo a cabo del 15 al 18 de mayo en la capital australiana. Teniendo como objetivo ofrecer una nueva visión para lograr la prosperidad nacional y el progreso social, explorando cómo las empresas, el gobierno, la educación, el derecho, la salud y los medios de comunicación pueden fortalecer a las familias.

Es la primera vez que el Congreso Mundial de las Familias se organiza de forma conjunta entre dos países, que fueron en esta edición Australia y Nueva Zelanda, y la primera vez que se celebra en esta región del mundo.

Se desarrollaron a través de mesas redondas, ponencias, coloquios y seminarios temas como "Familias fuertes construyen sociedades fuertes", "Familia y Educación: fundamentos de una sociedad civilizada", o "Prácticas que afectan al matrimonio y a la familia"

Temas muy arraigados dentro del perfil de asistentes que asisten de manera regular a estos Congresos se desarrollaron como fueron: las políticas de control de la natalidad, los ataques al derecho a la vida (eutanasia, aborto, falta de apoyo a la maternidad, anticoncepción, suicidio...), la adopción, la educación sexual y los derechos de los padres frente a la ideologización en la escuela, la industria del sexo (pornografía, prostitución, explotación infantil..), la herencia y la tradición en la trasmisión de cultura, los nuevos retos que abre la sociedad de las nuevas tecnologías en el seno de la familia.

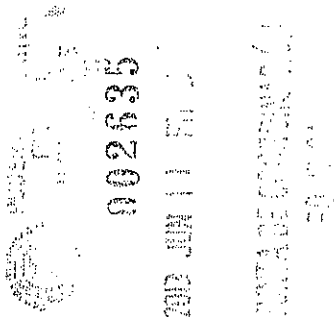

2. Desarrollo

Participo en las actividades y sesiones plenarias del foro, en donde se compartió los alcances del 6º Foro Mundial del Agua y se discutió sobre el diseño y el proceso temático que se seguiría para la realización del 7º Foro Mundial del Agua, a realizarse en Corea en el año 2015, año en que se cumplen los Objetivos del Milenio, de la Organización de las Naciones Unidas.

Se escucharon y compartieron ideas y conocimientos con diversos actores de otras nacionalidades y sectores como funcionarios, academia, ONG's entre otros, sobre mejores prácticas y como encaminarlas a la vanguardia en cuestiones relativas al tema del agua y recursos hidráulicos en el mundo y en el país.

3. Conclusiones:

La reunión de Inauguración del 7to. Foro Mundial del Agua se llevó a cabo exitosamente con más de 500 participantes de un total de 41 países.

La participación fue vital para el éxito del 7to. Foro Mundial del Agua en 2015 y se aprecia la acertada cooperación.

1.- Cada país debe impulsar Legislaciones claras y estables destinadas al ordenamiento de los recursos hidráulicos

2.- Especialmente debemos tener en cuenta los acuerdos alcanzados en torno al calentamiento global y el respeto al medio ambiente.

3.- la demanda de agua potable se incrementara en los próximos 25 años en un 60 %. Por lo que el agotamiento del agua debe encararse en cada país como un tema primordial y de Seguridad Nacional.
